MEETING MINUTES: There was a good turnout for the meeting with first time attendees Bill Dalton, Eric Yeager, and Mike Brennecke and his son Ryan being welcomed to the meeting.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer, Kelly Faust read the Treasurer's Report and it was accepted as read.

MARCH MEETING: This meeting included discussion about getting the planning committee for the annual Fall Hunt together, discussion of the possibility of holding a "treasure expo" in the St. Louis area in 2016, a summary of the informal group hunt schedule, while other topics covered were various hunt flyers from other clubs, and a comment of a potential Civil War battlefield study that may take place this year.

MARCH MEETING THEME: I put together a presentation on the history of die cast model

cars as the category for March was TOYS found while detecting. Members gathered up all their Tootsie toy cars, toy guns, and all other toy related items they had found and brought them to the meeting and told us all about them. There were some great displays of the die cast cars and many other toy items. My presentation included the history of several manufacturers of toy cars and included information about some of the more valuable and collectible ones. Mike Heisler had suggested the idea of various themes for upcoming meetings saying he knows we all have tons of detecting finds that can be categorized such as rings, Boy Scout items, rings, tokens, jewelry, bullets, lipstick, and many others. We decided to pick a new category for each following meeting this year to highlight certain finds, with members bringing in items that fall into that category. Go through all your finds and get them organized by category and plan on participating each month in the show

and tell.

APRIL MEETING PRESENTATION: I have an individual, Ted Allison, lined up to give a presentation at the April meeting on the History of U. S. Coins. He has suggested that members bring in any of their old coins they would like him to look at and have him tell more about them.

APRIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTED FIND: It was decided at the March meeting that TOKENS found while metal detecting will be the highlighted item to bring in for show and tell. So if you have some interesting tokens that you may have researched on the internet that you have found, or just a token collection, in general, you would like to show everyone, bring them to the meeting and tell us all about them

TREASURE/RELIC EXPO: Club member, Jerry Rowe, had contacted me with a proposal to put on a "Midwest Treasure/Relic Expo" to be held in the St. Louis area perhaps in 2016. His concept included inviting clubs and detector manufacturers located throughout the Midwestern states to participate with displays, booths, seminars, and detector manufacturers equipment displays. I presented this at our March meeting to see if our members felt this is something they would be willing to support and participate in developing the planning, the organizing, and all other requirements to put on such an expo. Following a lengthy discussion among members, there seemed to be more questions on how such an extensive endeavor could be put together, the cost of such an event, who would do all the work to make it happen, who would handle all of the coordination of planning, sending out information, and actually making it happen. I have since talked with Jerry Rowe and told him that at this time I personally did not feel like it was something I felt I could handle with

the appropriate effort it would take to make it successful. Jerry may contact Keith Wills in Texas, or perhaps some other people he knows, to see if any are interested in making such an event happen.

FLINT HILL, MO HUNT: Club member, Tim Mcniff, is working on setting up an outing to a site in Flint Hill, MO sometime later this summer. Club members would be allowed to hunt a school yard, a picnic area, and an old cemetery in exchange for the club giving a metal detecting presentation to a class of students at the school, perhaps in the September timeframe. Details will be worked out and a date and location will be provided once they are completed.

CIVIL WAR BATTLEFIELD STUDY: I have not been contacted by Professor of Archaeology at Lindenwood College, Steve Dashovich, about the possibility of our club being invited to participate with him and his group in doing a Civil War battlefield study somewhere in Missouri this year. I will provide more details should I hear back from Steve in case you are interested in participating.
