MEETING MINUTES: There was a nice turnout for the meeting with no new attendees.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer, Kelly Faust read the Treasurer's Report and it was accepted as read.

APRIL MEETING: At the April meeting I brought in various display items and materials and did demonstrations on how to clean metal detecting finds such as coins and artifacts. Several members had the opportunity to try the various cleaning methods on coins and other items I have found and needed to be cleaned. It was a good "hands on" chance for members who may not have tried any of the many methods of cleaning detecting finds that were presented.

MAY MEETING: Esley Hamilton, St. Louis County Historian, will be giving a presentation on the history of St. Louis County parks at the May meeting. This should provide club members with a good chance to learn about the many county parks and their history. Hope to see many of you there. I will also be informing members of where we will be holding club meetings for the rest of the year-a summary is provided in this newsletter. There will be other items discussed such as the upcoming Spring Hunt, a special hunt just established, and other pertinent club items.

NEW MEETING LOCATION: The May club meeting on the 19th will be AT A NEW LOCATION at the St. Louis County Library-Rock Road Branch at 10267 St. Charles Rock Road (map provided). The St. Louis County Library has meeting rooms at each branch that can be reserved for use. All meetings will have a new start time of 7:00 PM and the rooms will be available from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM to allow for room set up and take down of chairs and tables. We can still make our

own coffee and the library has soda and coffee machines available, if you prefer that-there is a charge for these beverages. I have managed to find dates for the rest of the year to use for meetings and it is provided as follows (mark your calendar for future reference):

Note the two different locations due to the difficulty in finding meeting rooms available on a consistent day for each month at the same location due to the popularity of the library meeting rooms. If we continue to use the library rooms for 2017, hopefully I can get a single location on the same day for each month for the whole year.

SPECIAL HUNT ESTABLISHED: Club members, Tim McNiff and Carl Boekemier, and myself gave a metal detecting presentation on May 5th to a group of kids at the Every Child's Hope facility located at 8240 St. Charles Rock Road. Tim made the arrangements to do this with Mike Brennan, Director of the facility and in exchange, we have been given the opportunity to metal detect this facility as a group. The site dates back to 1858 and as far as Mike knows has only been metal detected once quite a few years ago. It is currently in use and has children homed and schooled there. We have set a date of Saturday, May 21st to hunt the site beginning at about 8:00 AM and going until about 3:00

PM. Anyone participating in this hunt shall keep any and all items dug, including trash in their own separate container as they hunt during the day as we may be asked to show it to facility officials so they can see what has been found. Anything of a personal or historical nature that may be pertinent to the history of the facility may want to be kept by them for their use. All rules of the Treasure Hunter's Code of Ethics must be followed as we hunt these grounds: holes filled, trash removed, act in a professional manner, etc.we want to leave them with a good impression of our club and how we operate. There is free access to the entire grounds which are quite large, but we have been told to not detect too close to the buildings/homes where the children are housed. I have included a photomap of the location which is just east of Highway 170 in between Lackland Road and North and South. The main entrance is off St. Charles Rock Road where the two large entry columns are with the ECH and 8240 signs. Using this entrance, come in on the circular drive to the far end and go past the large building to the east end of it where you will see a driveway going into a parking lot just east of the main building (ignore the "do not enter" sign) and park in the lot. Another entrance is off North and South and takes you directly into the parking lot. There are some eating places in the area or bring a sack lunch and drinks if you prefer. Big thanks go to Tim for making this hunt possible and to Carl and Tim for their help in putting on the class presentation. The boys in the class enjoyed it and the highlight for them was when we took them outside to use the detectors and pinpointers to find coins that we had "seeded" for them to find. Drop me a note back if you have any questions-I will discuss this more at the club meeting on the 19th and our Spring Hunt on May 22nd at Benton Park is still on and details for it are in this club newsletter.
