- 11. 1958 Wheat penny
- 12. Skeleton Key
- 13. Gold Ring with Stone

- 16. State Tax Token
- 17. Silver Charm
- 18. Knife, Fork, AND Spoon
- 19. Button with Maker name
- 20. A RED Die cast or Matchbox-type vehicle
