6. Ammunition
7. Pocket knife

10. 2 Foreign Coins
11. 1958 Wheat penny
12. Skeleton Key
13. Gold Ring with Stone
14. Religious Item
15. Old Car or House Key
16. State Tax Token
17. Silver Charm
18. Knife, Fork, AND Spoon
19. Button with Maker name
20. A RED Die cast or Matchbox-type vehicle

Hunt sites are determined by their potential chance to provide older, historic finds and are available with proper permission for a group of members to hunt.
