- 20. Zippo-type lighter
- 21. Token, non-state tax

**RULES:** Remain the same. Member with the highest number of finds is the winner. A found item can be used in only one category and only one item per category. Tracking sheets are at each meeting. The Honor System will apply, but it would be interesting if the items were brought to the

CLUB DUES CHANGED!!!!!: Club dues for 2018 process has CHANGED!! Dues will now be due during January of 2018 for the 2018 year.
